Congress has put away No Child Left Behind for good, creating a new day for music education that encourages you to be involved:

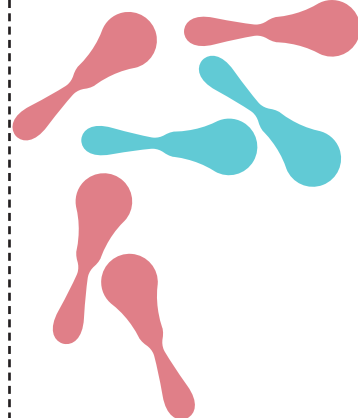
- Specific and stand-alone mention of music as an important component of a well-rounded education
