Take Action! – Advocate for Your School’s Music Program

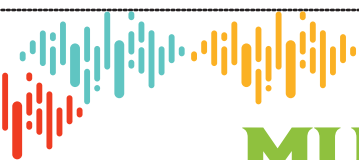
Become an advocate at the state and local level through the Civic Action Field Guide:
