All our students respect the property of others. 

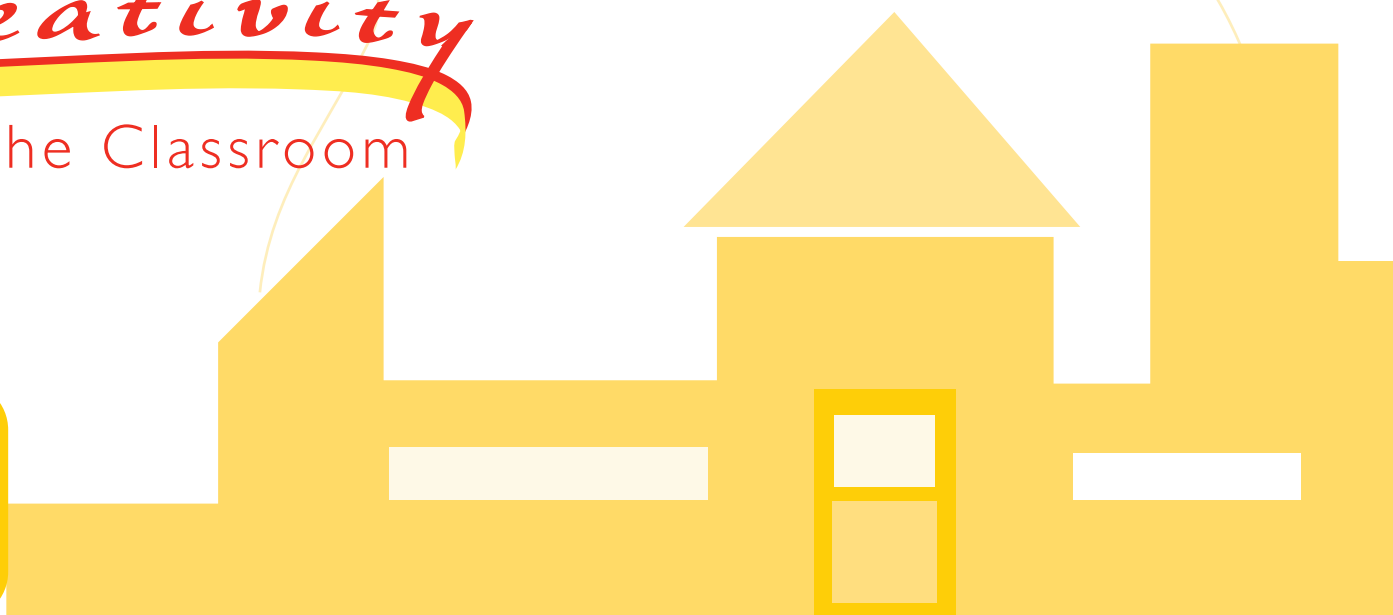
We don't damage other people's property—so we take care not to break anyone's calculators, tear anyone's books, or make marks on the school walls.
